Pere Ubu emerged from the urban frontier of mid-'70s Cleveland to impact the American underground for generations to follow. Led by David Thomas, whose innovative vocal style and rapturously eccentric lyrics have remained the band's creative focus throughout a long, convoluted career, Ubu's protean art-punk sound captured the angst and chaos of the times with both apocalyptic fervour and surprising humanity. With a unique mixture of control and anarchy, Pere Ubu changed the face of music. Now Pere Ubu construct a live, often improvised, underscore to Ray Bradbury's 1953 Sci-Fi Classic critique of post-war racial isolationism. Much of Bradbury's poetic original screen treatment, edited out of the final film, is restored by way of voice-overs.

It Came from Outer Space. This red/green anaglyphic 3D stereoscopic print is thought to be the last complete unfaded working example to exist in any of the film archives of the world.
